

- Alternate Mounting Info and Ideas

- 1. No wrong way to mount the kit, only most preferred from our experiences.
- If included template does not fit your project, mount the top cleats first and then fit the lower cleats to suit the application. No Worries!
- 3. Any location for the 4 cleats that can work will be fine and will carry the load of your Varden.
- 4. Generally the upper and lower cleats are 20" apart (see pics).
- 5. Flange in and out locations differ (see pics) but you just don't want cleats to interfere with trays.
- The above holds true for post mounts and leaning 2x4 mounts against walls too. Get creative!




