Our living retaining wall block is a revolutionary product for landscape contractors trying to save time and money when installing medium height residential or commercial walls.



PAST PROJECTS



250 Green Blocks shipped to Spokane, WA for a residential backyard project. The main wall is 4' high and tapers down from there. It will be planted in Spring 2023 with Sedum and English ivy.



200 Gray Blocks shipped to a church in Annapolis, MD to facilitate the installation of a rain garden. After installation it was planted native perennials which still thrive with minimal maintenance. 500 Tan Blocks shipped to a Nursery in Orange County, CA that doubles as a display and a photo background in their event space. The wall curves in and out of the property to create terraces at a range of 4'-5'. Planted with various succulents & ground covers.



1,100 Gray Blocks shipped to Sag Harbor, NY for a residential backyard renovation. Bought by a construction company and subcontracted to a local landscaper. The main wall is 5' tall and tapers from there. It will be planted with Sedum in Spring 2023.
